



WRUU 107.5 FM wants to engage volunteers, hosts, and supporters to help solve the critical need for poll workers for the November 3, 2020, General Election. Some poll workers who are older and at increased risk for COVID are dropping out. In addition, new voting machines were put in use in Georgia this year, so demands for more tech savvy poll workers is imperative.

A WRUU POLL WORKER TEAM would serve our community mission well. You know how threatened this year's elections seem, and you can help by serving as a well-trained and attentive poll worker.

APPLICATIONS are being accepted *in person only* at the **Chatham County Board of Elections (BOE)** at 1117 Eisenhower Drive, Suite F, Savannah, Georgia. Chatham County applicants must be:

- A US Citizen
- At least 16 years old
- Able to read, write and speak the English language
- Live in the jurisdiction

New applicants for these poll clerk positions must bring their photo I.D. for the application/intake process, which includes completing a W-4 and a background check. People with felony convictions will not be considered. The process takes about 15 minutes.

TRAININGS HAVE STARTED. Approved new hires must attend two three-hour trainings. There are class size-limitations, so *apply to the BOE now* for better access to the full slate. The BOE pays poll workers \$40 for training and \$165 for serving at their assigned poll as scheduled on Election Day.
